

# Team Fortress 2 Ordinance

This Ordinance States:

*Effective October 2018*

As of October 2018, the Villoux Server System will re-establish Team Fortress 2 as one of the system's official gaming departments. The game was formerly recognized as a department from September 2011 - September 2015 and much of this ordinance draws upon Villoux's previous experience in hosting a Team Fortress 2 Department. This ordinance does not fully cover all material listed in the System Staff Ordinance or Unity Ordinance, which also heavily governs the Team Fortress 2 Department's administration, so it is recommended that Team Fortress 2 Server Heads also familiarize themselves with those ordinances as well, though this is not recommended for server staff or users, nor is this ordinance completely reflective of all other ordinances within the Villoux Bill of Ordinances that may also hold some governance over this department. Though the Villoux Chief of Staff is the ultimate enforcer of all ordinances within the Villoux Bill of Ordinances, this ordinance shall be the direct responsibility of the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman to enforce and all users within the Team Fortress 2 Department will be required to abide by the regulations outlined in this ordinance.

## *Section 1 - General Information*

Steam Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The digital distribution platform Steam will be required to access any Villoux Team Fortress 2 server. As Steam is the distributor of Team Fortress 2, the term "Steam account" will replace the term "Team Fortress 2 account" where is appropriate in this ordinance.

### IronRain Clause

*Effective October 2018*

As in accordance with the Public Channel Clause and the Priest of the Ogreslord Clause of the Discord Ordinance, each Team Fortress 2 server owned or operated by the Villoux Server System will be allotted no less than one public voice channel and one public text channel on the Villoux Discord Server. Additional channels may be granted as in accordance to the Priest of the Ogreslord Clause of the Discord Ordinance. Officials within the Team Fortress 2 such as Team Fortress 2 Server Heads and server staff do not hold authority on the Villoux Discord Server. Instead, it is the responsibility of the Villoux Discord Operation Department to ensure peacefulness within the Team Fortress 2 category on Discord. All other information regarding Villoux's Discord Server can be found in the Discord Ordinance.

### Idaca Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Each Team Fortress 2 server owned or operated by the Villoux Server System will be granted a page on Villoux's website under the "Servers" tab of the website. This page will list a description of the server, all of the server's rules, all commands available to server groups, donation packages, server staff, and any other pertinent information. Each Team Fortress 2 Server Head is responsible for ensuring the information listed on their respective server's page is accurate and kept up-to-date. Should any changes need to be made, a Team Fortress 2 Server Head should request the change to the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman who will then forward the changes to the Executive System Coder, the user responsible for the upkeep of Villoux's website.

### TheHatchling Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Whilst playing on Villoux Team Fortress 2 servers, users must be recognized by their system-defined name. Should a user's system-defined name be different than their Steam account's name, said user will be granted a nickname reflective of their system-defined name on all of Villoux's Team Fortress 2 servers. Otherwise, nicknames may not be applied to users on any Villoux Team Fortress 2 server. Information about system-defined names can be found in the System Name Ordinance.

## Section 2 - Staff Structure

### Dr. Baskerville Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The Villoux Team Fortress 2 Department is ultimately governed by the Villoux Grand Council. The Grand Council shall appoint a Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman to oversee the operations within the Team Fortress 2 Department and the Chairman shall appoint one Team Fortress 2 Server Head to each Team Fortress 2 server owned or operated by the Villoux Server System. Team Fortress 2 Server Heads shall appoint staff to aid in the administration of their respective server, but these server staff members are not considered members of the system's staff. The Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman shall also appoint a Team Fortress 2 Tournament Master to aid in the hosting and administration of Villoux's Team Fortress 2 tournaments. The Team Fortress 2 Tournament Master may hire up to five Team Fortress 2 Tournament Directors, which will be recognized as members of system staff. The Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman shall appoint and demote Team Fortress 2 Server Heads, the Team Fortress 2 Tournament Master, and Team Fortress 2 Tournament Directors, and Team Fortress 2 server staff as is seen fit.

### DeathAngel Clause

*Effective October 2018*

This clause shall outline Villoux's recommended staff structure for server staff, though this clause serves merely as a recommendation and is not required to be followed unless directed otherwise by the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman.

It is recommended that Team Fortress 2 Server Heads appoint a head moderator to aid in the moderation of their respective server. The server may hold as many additional moderators as is necessary. The role of moderators should be to enforce the server's basic rules such as chat and naming restrictions and render punishment against violators of said rules. It should be ensured that moderators cover as many time zones as possible to ensure there is always authority on the server. Moderators should report to the head moderator.

It is recommended that Team Fortress 2 Server Heads also appoint a head admin to aid in the administration of their respective server. The server may hold as many additional admins as is necessary. The role of admins should be higher than that of moderators and, as such, admins should have access to game-altering features not accessible to moderators. Admins should report to the head admin.

Any server not following this model must provide an outline of their staff structure to the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman who must then approve said outline. Once approved, the outline and all server staff shall be noted on the server's respective webpage.

Captain Turtles Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The Villoux Chief of Staff and the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman are required to have access to all permissions on every Villoux owned or operated Team Fortress 2 server. The Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman will then decide which permissions are accessible by Team Fortress 2 Server Heads and their respective staff. Furthermore, members of Villoux's System Coding Department may be granted temporary access to permissions or server files at the approval of the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman.

Smudd Clause

*Effective October 2018*

As in accordance to the Smudd Clause of the Unity Ordinance, all Villoux Grand Council Members will be granted basic moderator permissions on all Villoux owned or operated Team Fortress 2 servers, though they may not be granted game-altering features. Grand Council Members are ineligible to hold any other server staff positions. It should be clearly noted that Grand Council Members are not considered moderators for any Minecraft server despite having moderation permissions.

### Section 3 - Server Information

#### Zalzam Clause

*Effective October 2018*

As in accordance with the Kosoisko Clause of the Unity Ordinance, no Team Fortress 2 servers within the Villoux Server System shall be permitted to operate under the same themes so as to avoid internal competition. For example, if the Team Fortress 2 Department operates a low-gravity crit. server, no other servers within the Team Fortress 2 Department will offer a low-gravity crit. server.

#### Steve Clause

*Effective October 2018*

As in accordance with the Highlander Clause of the Unity Ordinance, all Villoux owned or operated Minecraft servers shall display their membership in the Villoux Server System in their server's connection message.

#### DragonBreath75 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

As in accordance with the Cody Clause of the Unity Ordinance, should any clauses in this ordinance violate a Team Fortress 2 server's theme, the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman may petition the Villoux Grand Council to exempt said server from following said specific clause; however, until the Grand Council authorizes such an exemption the server shall be required to follow the clause.

#### Angelberry Clause

*Effective November 2018*

In order to promote users to use Villoux's Discord Server, in-game voice chat will be restricted by teams on all Villoux Team Fortress 2 servers. This will allow users on the same team to strategize with one another and will encourage them to join the greater Villoux community should they enjoy socializing with other Villouxians. Text conversation will be available both globally as well as by team. Staff on Team Fortress 2 servers will be allowed to use global voice chat for moderation purposes.

### Lingual Clause

*Effective September 2017*

The Lingual Ordinance of the Villoux Bill of Ordinances outlines English, French, and Portuguese as the official languages of the Villoux Server System. All text messages sent on Villoux Team Fortress 2 servers must be sent in one of these languages, else they will be deleted and considered spam. All voice chat must also be contained to one of these languages, else users risk being muted for “Mic. Spam”. Users whom are unable to communicate in the aforementioned languages are found automatically guilty of any charge made against them.

## ***Section 4 - Server Ban Offenses***

### Mixizm Clause

*Effective October 2018*

User prohibitions may vary by Team Fortress 2 server and ban durations may differ, however all Team Fortress 2 servers owned or operated by the Villoux Server System are required to enforce all regulations outlined in this section. Each prohibition within this section and any additional prohibitions must be listed on the physical server as well as on the server’s website page to ensure all users on the server have a clear understanding of the rules. The Discord Ordinance also provides further information on ban-worthy offenses.

### Senko Clause

*Effective November 2018*

Users that display sprays that violate any of this ordinance’s clauses will be kicked from the server in order to clear their spray from the server. Prior to kicking them, a member of staff will explain why the spray is inappropriate and request them not to use it again. If the user returns after the kick and uses the spray again, they are to be banned for two hours for “Refusing to Cooperate”.

### Sweetheear Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Should a member of a server's staff intentionally misuse their granted permissions or show intentions of causing harm to a server with their granted permissions, the member of staff will be demoted from their position and charged with abuse of permissions. The ban duration for "Abuse of Permissions" ranges from thirty days to a permanent ban depending on the severity of the situation.

Should a Villoux Grand Council Member be abusing their permissions, the incident should be reported directly to the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman or the Villoux Chief of Staff.

### Wrench Clause

*Effective November 2018*

Any user intentionally misusing the vote menu in an attempt to troll or harass another user will be charged with abusing the vote menu. This is most commonly defined as calling three votes in a row, preventing other users from starting a vote. The ban duration for "Abusing the Vote Menu" is one hour.

### Crazycat Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users that post information regarding other Team Fortress servers or gaming communities will be charged with "Advertising". To be charged, the user does not have to post the connection information for another server or community; the mere discussion of exterior communities is prohibited. Depending on the severity and the intention of the advertising, bans for "Advertising" range from thirty-days to permanent bans.

### ShadowBoo Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Ban evading is defined as a user connecting to a Team Fortress 2 server from which they were banned during the lasting duration of said ban. Upon identification as a banned user, the user is to

be re-banned from the server. The ban duration for “Ban Evading” is a reset of the previous ban duration plus an additional eight hours.

Theabn Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The act of a server staff member accepting money, items, favors, or other goods/services in payment for using his or her position in a certain way shall result in the user initiating the transaction being charged with bribery and the server staff member being demoted from their position and being charged with abuse of permissions. It should be noted that the transaction must have actually taken place in order for this charge to be valid; attempting to bribe a server staff member does not equate to bribery, though it may be punished in other ways. The ban duration for “Bribery” is thirty days.

RockyICE Clause

*Effective November 2018*

Users that maliciously and rapidly stand on and then off a point in order to trigger the in-game announcer’s voice lines indicating a point is being capped will be charged with cap spamming. The ban duration for “Cap Spam” is one hour.

Cronus Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users that are openly aggressive and unruly with server staff may be charged with disrespect to server staff. Having disagreements with members of the server staff or questioning a member of staff for taking an action are not considered disrespect. The ban for duration for “Disrespect to Server Staff” is two hours.



Snuffy Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Distribution of any pornographic content including links in chat sprays is strictly prohibited. The KirinaeWindstalker Clause of the Discord Ordinance outlines specific definitions of pornography. The ban duration for “Distribution of Pornography” is one hour.

Mason917061 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The act of intentionally revealing otherwise secret information shall be considered distribution of private information. This charge can range from distributing user’s personal information such as IP addresses, current business or home residences, phone numbers, pictures, real names, or online profiles without the consent of said user. This charge also extends to distributing private information about the server or potential staff decisions. It should be clearly noted that users may distribute their own personal information to whomever they feel worthy and may not be charged with distribution of private information for distributing their own information. The ban duration for “Distribution of Private Information” is one week.

Ramt1 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Should a user intentionally utilize an error in permissions, abuse a glitch on a server, or otherwise act with authority they should not hold, the user will be charged with exploitation. The ban duration for “Exploitation” ranges from one week to thirty days depending on the severity of the exploit.

CQC Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users who intentionally feed projectiles that can be reflected by Pyros, such as rockets and arrows, will be charged with “Feeding Pyros”. Users are to first be issued a warning to stop feeding Pyros,

but if they continue to feed, they will be issued a one hour ban for “Feeding Pyros”. The banner may opt to also ban the user for “Refusing to Cooperate”.

#### TickleMyCow Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users may not use any outside mods or plugins not endorsed by the respective Team Fortress 2 server on which they are playing. Furthermore, users are prohibited from linking any such features to other users on Villoux Team Fortress 2 servers. Failure to comply with this rule may result in a permanent ban for “Hacking”. The member of staff whom bans any user for “Hacking” must record a demo of the user using the hacks to verify the hacking.

#### Carosivv Clause

*Effective October 2018*

If a user trolls another user multiple times over a period of time or personally attacks another user, the offending user may be charged with harassment. Harassment is inclusive of racism, sexism, homophobia, and other forms of discrimination, and the Spree Clause (racism) and the Icyx Clause (harassment) of the Discord Ordinance should be referred to when determining whether or not a statement is racist or harassing. The ban duration for “Harassment” is two hours.

#### Ianbobtron Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Intentionally spreading mistruths, speculated gossip, or otherwise made up stories to server staff members shall be considered lying to server staff. It should be noted that this lie must have been perpetrated in a scenario wherein a member of server staff was acting in their official capacity, e.g. responding to a report by a user. This charge cannot be used in cases where role-play is accepted on the server. The ban duration for “Lying to Server Staff” ranges from one week to thirty days depending on the severity of the lie.

### Penguin Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users may not use proxies, VPNs, or any other form of IP masks on any Villoux Team Fortress 2 server unless granted approval by the Villoux Chief of Staff. Failure to comply with this rule may result in a permanent ban for “Proxy Usage”.

### Pwnzy Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Any user that fails to comply with direct orders given to them by members of a Minecraft server’s staff are eligible to be charged with refusing to cooperate. This can range from refusing to divulge pertinent information to obstruction of justice to any other action that interferes with the server staff’s ability to perform their job. The ban duration for “Refusing to Cooperate” is two hours.

### Pbarron88 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Whereas not generally considered a ban-worthy offense, profanity should not be used in excess, though it should be noted that servers are free to set their own standards on the volume and frequency at which profanity may be used. The Pbarron88 Clause of the Discord Ordinance outlines the Villoux Server System’s definitions for profanity. Failure to comply with this rule may result in a ban for “Refusing to Cooperate”.

### Nexe Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users with Steam avatars that violate the Team Fortress 2 Department’s standards for harassment, pornography, or other prohibited content will be requested to change their Steam avatar. If a user refuses to change their Steam avatar, the user will be banned from the server for “Refusing to Cooperate”.

Saucy Lettuce Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The Team Fortress 2 Department will define any noise that comes from a user's microphone that is not the user's voice as "Mic. Spam". This includes, but is not limited to: barking, clicking, crying, ruffling, breathing, blowing, singing, screaming, and typing.

ChewOnDiss Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Trolling is defined as intentionally annoying or attempting to annoy other users. The ban duration for "Trolling" is one hour.

***Section 5 - Server Ban Classifications & Proceedings***

Crokey Clause

*Effective October 2018*

It should be very clearly noted that whereas banning users is within the ability of server staff, it does not always have to be the only option. It is the primary responsibility of server staff to maintain peace on the Team Fortress 2 servers, which sometimes means issuing bans, but does not always have to. Server staff are encouraged to work with users to resolve issues before banning them. Generally, users should be kicked from the server at least once as a warning before being banned. Albeit a necessity in certain situations, issuing bans should be a last resort, and server staff should always try to resolve issues in the most peaceful yet efficient way.

xCreepex Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Once a Team Fortress 2 server ban has been issued, the member of server staff that issued the ban must submit a "ban report" to the respective server's Team Fortress 2 Server Head. The ban report should be formatted as follows: username of banned user, Discord client number, nationality of

banned user, charge, brief description of the events, date, user that banned the user, banner's rank, user that reported the user, reporter's rank, ban duration. If any of the above information is unavailable, the server staff member should write "N/A". The Team Fortress 2 Server Head will then forward the report to the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman who will relay it to the Villoux Chief of Staff to be entered into the Villoux User Reports. Failure to submit ban reports may result in a demotion from server staff and a ban for "Abuse of Permissions".

#### Cody Clause

*Effective October 2018*

It should be noted a clear difference exists between bans from Villoux Team Fortress 2 servers and Villoux's Discord Server. Should a user be banned from Villoux's Discord Server, said ban does not translate to Team Fortress 2 servers; nor does a ban from a Team Fortress 2 server translate to a ban from said server's Discord channels. This application applies to Villoux's TeamSpeak Server as well. Should a user present issues on both services, two separate bans must be issued against said user. Moreover, a ban from one Team Fortress 2 server does not translate to a ban on any other Team Fortress 2 servers with the exception of department bans and system bans.

#### Bosiephus Clause

*Effective October 2018*

If a user is banned for multiple offensives, their ban duration is to reflect each ban individually. For example, if a user is to be banned for "Trolling and Refusing to Cooperate", their ban time will be three hours opposed to one or two hours. There is no limit as to how many offensives can be registered against one user at a given time.

#### Spazproof Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Should a user receive multiple bans from the same server, the bans will begin to stack. Upon three bans being issued, the fourth ban will be issued for one week opposed to the normal ban duration,

except in the case that a normal ban duration would exceed one week. Should the user return after the fourth ban and continue to cause issues, a thirty-day ban shall be issued against said user opposed to the normal ban duration unless the normal ban duration would exceed thirty-days. It is recommended that the sixth ban be a permanent server ban, though it should be clearly noted that Team Fortress 2 Server Heads may decide to issue a permanent ban far sooner than after six bans but not before at least three bans have been issued.

Cap1991 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users that have proven to remain a regular rule violator within the Team Fortress 2 Department may be issued a department ban by the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman. A department ban is a complete ban of the user from all of Villoux's Team Fortress 2 servers, any events sponsored by the Team Fortress 2 Department, and all channels within the Team Fortress 2 category on Villoux's Discord Server. As defined by the Joepr9 Clause of the Discord Ordinance, department bans may only be issued by the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman.

101Blasphemy101 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

The Villoux Server System considers a "system ban" to be the ultimate punishment within the system. A system ban is a permanent ban from all Villoux owned or operated servers, groups, tournaments, websites, and other entities, and as such, system banned users are strictly prohibited from connecting to any Villoux owned or operated Villoux Team Fortress 2 server or event. Should a system banned user connect to the Discord server, the Villoux Chief of Staff should be notified immediately. If neither the Chief of Staff nor a Grand Council Member is available, a ban should be formatted against the user for the maximum allowed time for the reason "Ban Evading". The incident should then be reported to the Chief of Staff or other Grand Council Members upon seeing them. It is the responsibility of the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman to ensure that a system ban list is in effect across all Villoux Team Fortress 2 servers.

Dragonride Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users may appeal a server ban by submitting a ban appeal to the respective Team Fortress 2 server's Team Fortress 2 Server Head. This appeal should outline how the user plans on changing if allowed to return to the server and include an apology for their past transgressions. Using the same criteria, department bans may be appealed by submitting an appeal to the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman, and system bans may be appealed by submitting an appeal to the Villoux Grand Council. Team Fortress 2 Server Heads do not have authority to appeal department bans and neither Team Fortress 2 Server Heads nor the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman have authority to appeal a system ban.

**Section 6 - Server Donations & Rewards**

Priest of the Ogrelord Clause

*Effective October 2018*

All donations to any Villoux owned or operated Team Fortress 2 server must be submitted to [donations@villoux.com](mailto:donations@villoux.com) via PayPal. When asked by PayPal if “sending money to friends or family” or “paying for goods or services”, users should select “sending money to friends or family” and ensure the currency is set to U.S. Dollar (USD). Any donation not received in USD will be converted to USD and the donator will be rewarded based on the conversion. Finally, users should ensure that in the “message” blank they state their in-game name and to which specific Team Fortress 2 server they are donating. Donations submitted via any other means will not be recognized by the Team Fortress 2 Department.

CnTexas96 Clause

*Effective October 2018*

As in accordance to the CnTexas96 Clause of the Unity Ordinance, no Team Fortress 2 server owned or operated by the Villoux Server System will be permitted to require users to pay to play on them. Whereas donations can be encouraged and incentivized, Team Fortress 2 Server Heads may not directly request donations from users.

## Section 7 - Tournament Information

### Headph Clause

*Effective August 2019*

The Team Fortress 2 Department will host a tournament each month. The Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman and the Team Fortress 2 Tournament Master will determine a theme for the tournament with consideration to the map, game mode, and permitted or restricted items. Tournaments must be hosted on a Villoux Team Fortress 2 server but may change settings on the server in the event the server's settings contradict the theme of the tournament. The tournaments will only consist of two teams with the participants on each team being randomly assigned by the Team Fortress 2 Tournament Master. The teams will play three matches and the team with the highest cumulative wins will win the tournament. All tournament participants must remain in the Team Fortress 2 voice channel on Villoux's Discord Server for the duration of the tournament and are encouraged to use in-game voice chat to speak with their teammates. It is the responsibility of the Team Fortress 2 Tournament Master to coordinate the tournament with assistance from the Team Fortress 2 Tournament Directors.

### Joe Clause

*Effective August 2019*

The master of ceremonies will read an opening speech to explain all of the tournament's rules and proceedings prior the tournament's start. The tournament master will read a closing speech congratulating the tournament champion, thanking participants for playing in the tournament, and encouraging registration at future tournaments at the conclusion of the tournament.

### Biko Clause

*Effective August 2019*

System Commercialists may stream Villoux's Team Fortress 2 tournament's gameplay with the consent of the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman and the Executive System Press Officer but must receive consent from all users whose voices would appear on the stream in order to stream the audio of the tournament. A user who is not a System Commercialist must receive permission from



the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman, the Villoux Chief of Staff, and all users whose voices would appear on the stream in order to stream a tournament.

Tixie Clause

*Effective August 2019*

The Team Fortress 2 tournament staff will meet in the Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman's private voice channel on Villoux's Discord Server once a winning team has been determined to discuss whom they feel should be named "tournament champion". This is an honorary title that does not bestow any additional rights to the recognized user. The tournament champion will be a user the Team Fortress 2 tournament staff feel contributed greatly to their team, served as a good leader or example to other users, and was skilled at their class. The tournament champion is not required to come from the winning team. In addition to being congratulated in the tournament's closing speech, the user should be recognized in #villoux\_announcements on Villoux's Discord Server, under the Team Fortress 2 Department's history on Villoux's website, and at the subsequent Villoux House of Players meeting in the Team Fortress 2 Department update.

Kailitan Clause

*Effective August 2019*

The Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman maintains the right to bestow a prize to the tournament champion in the form of items, keys, paints, and weapon skins, though this is not customary. The Team Fortress 2 Department Chairman may use his or her own personal funds to award the prize or may request an allowance from the Villoux Grand Council to cover the cost of the prize. It should be noted it is discouraged to award prizes as it creates an undesired competitive atmosphere in the tournament.

## *Section 8 - Account Responsibility*

### Rie Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Whereas users are permitted to use multiple Steam accounts on any given server at a time, any bans issued against one account shall be fluid throughout all accounts owned by the banned user as the ban is on the user themselves in addition to their specific account.

### Halle Clause

*Effective October 2018*

All users in the Villoux Server System are responsible of the actions that occur on their accounts, regardless of whether or not the actions were committed by the owner of the account. This includes "Abuse of Permissions". Whether the user allowed for the actions to occur or the user failed to provide proper security for their account, the user will be held accountable for the actions performed on his or her account as if he or she committed the actions. It is highly recommended that users with siblings or other persons that could easily access their account keep their account logged off or locked whenever they are not actively using it to prevent incidents from occurring.

### Varacka Clause

*Effective October 2018*

Users that can verify that their accounts have been hacked are granted immunity from any punishment by this ordinance, however the evidence that the account was hacked must be substantial and beyond a shadow of a doubt. If the user that hacked the account is a Villoux user, said user will be punished for the actions committed on the hacked account.
